





















## Largest ski areas

With the introduction of Skimiles, developed by Montenius, there is a new standard for measuring the size of ski areas, which, in addition to the length of ski runs, takes into account numerous other factors, that determine the subjectively perceived size of a ski area ([learn more](#)).
